#### FROM THE PASTOR'S MAILPOUCH

#### "Tradition - A Bane and a Blessing"

A **tradition** is a <u>belief</u> or <u>behavior</u> that is passed down within a family, group or society which carries with it special significance, with its origins being in the past. Some common examples include our Christian holy days and the menu that we have at our Thanksgiving Day meal. Much of what we do in the Christian Church has its

roots in the past. Hymns, liturgies, teachings ... all of these are part of a rich and infinitely valuable train of Biblical truth & church practice which moves the kingdom of God forward from the past to the present to the future.

Definitions: <u>Bane</u> - something that ruins a person's life

Blessing - something which improves the quality of a person's life

The blessing of **tradition** is found in the transmission of spiritual truth which connects the participants in a vibrant trusting relationship with the one true God (Father- Son-Holy Spirit). In such an experience, the beliefs and behaviors are not empty activities; but by the work of God, those traditions are used to draw people from the mundane and meaningless existence of life to a truly purposeful life in ongoing and intimate fellowship with God.

The bane of **tradition** is found in the transmission of belief and behavior which fail to draw a person into a deeper and more intimate relationship with God. Instead, the tradition itself become a god that is elevated and served, rather than the God to whom it is meant to point.

Within the local Christian congregation, there is always a tension that exists among the members when **tradition** is the issue. On the one hand, for those who are uncomfortable with change 'in general', or who have a strong sentimental attachment to the familiar traditions of the past, or who sincerely believe that nothing can replace or improve the present traditional practices ...... it is clear to them that tradition is a blessing and not at all a bane.

On the other hand, for those who have no vested emotional interest in the present traditional practices, but find a dis-connect between the church's tradition and the practical understanding and application of everyday life as a believer, ..... it is clear to them that tradition is a bane and not at all a blessing.

It is the responsibility of the divinely appointed spiritual leader (pastor) of the congregation to prayerfully navigate the ship of the church through the turbulent waters .... recognizing that tradition is both a bane and a blessing. Which old hymns are be to retained is matched with which new spiritual songs are to be introduced and used for worship. Which liturgies must continue, and what liturgical practices ought to be used to speak more clearly to a new generation without losing the sound Biblical content of the older liturgies?

This is the tight-rope walk which the present pastor has been striving to achieve since he came over 16 years ago. Changes have taken place over that period of time. They will continue to take place. However, it is important to know these three things:

1. Over the centuries within the Christian Church, although tradition has served to retain the truth of God's Word and to propel the Church forward in the right direction, traditions have changed.

2. Within the Christian Church today, all of those congregations which have a rich liturgical and musical heritage wrestle with the place of tradition and new forms and expressions of Christian worship.

3. Just as authentic as the Holy Spirit inspired hymns and liturgies of the past are the refreshing spiritual expressions of worship which the Holy Spirit in His creative power inspires in His people in this era of the Church.

What then is **the proper and God-pleasing attitude** that the LORD would have us hold as we continue to wrestle with the place of traditional expressions of worship and creatively new expressions of worship? **We must keep our hearts and minds on God Himself,** identifying both traditional and newly created expressions of worship as having originated from God; thus, moving you and me to give thanks to Him for both.

#### March Mission of the Month:

East European Missions Network

Eastern European Missions Network began in 1992 in the wake of the fall of communism. It is an evangelical, inter-Lutheran mission organization which seeks to encourage American churches to minister alongside the brothers and sisters in East European churches. Seeking to rebuild and equip the body of Christ in Eastern Europe and Russia.

EEMN's highest priority is to help train a new generation of Christ-centered, Bible-based leaders committed to fulfilling the Great Commission and the rebuilding of the church.

EEMN works in close relationship with indigenous believers in Belarus, Czech Republic, Estonia, Latvia, Poland, Russia, Slovakia, Ukraine, and Turkey. Bible Schools, seminaries, lay training, evangelism, discipleship, church planting, and prayers are the tools fro developing this long-term rebuilding.

As a sending agency EEMN has placed career missionaries in Poland, Latvia, Ukraine, and Hungary. From the historic fall of communism to the steady progress being made, the work of God in these nations is best described by the prophet Habakkuk, "Look among the nations and see, wonder and be astounded for I am doing a work in your day that you would not believe if told" (Habakkuk 1:5). Out of the hard and rocky soil of atheistic communism, God has prepared a field ripe for harvest.
