From the Pastor's Mail Pouch
"Hanging in There"

"And because lawlessness will be increased, the love of many will grow cold. But the one who endures to the end will be saved. And this gospel of the kingdom will be proclaimed throughout the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and then the end will come." Matthew 24:12-14



We are living in a non-Christian culture. It is referred to by some Christian Leaders as **"The Post-Christian Era."** We can no longer assume that the nation and community in which we grew up remains *"one nation under God."* This means that most of the people around us have different values, different priorities; in short, a very different understanding of the importance of the God of the Bible, reflected in the way that they think and live. Some of us have not even noticed this shift because we have also shifted along with the culture in which we are immersed.

In the above Bible passage, Jesus warns believers that as the end of the world approaches, this is the kind of challenge that those who would follow Him by faith will encounter. The good news is that He is with us and will never forsake us. He will give us the strength to endure. However, the key to experiencing the strength of Christ to endure an unbelieving and sometimes even hostile world ... is to remain close to Him.

Our closeness to Him is dependent upon our willingness to hear and heed the Word of God each day. In another place in the New Testament, the apostle John tells the Christian Church under persecution **[I John 5:4] " And this is the victory that has overcome the world—our faith."** The faith which is spoken of in the Bible never originates from us; rather, it starts with God and is placed within our hearts by God through the hearing of the Word of God. For **"faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of Christ."** [Romans 10:17]

The choice is simple. Either we can ignore the warning signs of the end and permit our lives to be lived apart from the powerful influence of God's Word in our daily routine; or, we can live the disciplined life of a true follower [*disciple*] of Jesus, and permit His words to be **'a lamp to our feet and a light to our path.'** As we yield to the Holy Spirit directing us to such a disciplined life, you and I will be able to **"hang in there."**

This is God's will for all of us. By His grace, He has afforded us a multitude of opportunities to be fed with this life-giving and life-keeping Word: daily devotional materials, weekly worship services, Christian hymns and spiritual songs, Bible study opportunities and Lenten worship services. So, taking hold of these tools, we shall grow in faith and overcome the world and its ways as we wait for Christ to come. With this reminder, let's **hang in there** together!

We have openings for children ages three and over. Please spread the word for us.

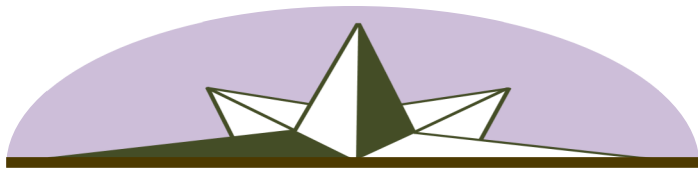

March Mission of the Month:

East European Missions Network

Eastern European Missions Network began in 1992 in the wake of the fall of communism. It is an evangelical, inter-Lutheran mission organization which seeks to encourage American churches to minister alongside the brothers and sisters in East European churches. Seeking to rebuild and equip the body of Christ in Eastern Europe and Russia.

EEMN's highest priority is to help train a new generation of Christ-centered, Bible-based leaders committed to fulfilling the Great Commission and the rebuilding of the church.

EEMN works in close relationship with indigenous believers in Belarus, Czech Republic, Estonia, Latvia, Poland, Russia, Slovakia, Ukraine, and Turkey. Bible Schools, seminaries, lay training, evangelism, discipleship, church planting, and prayers are the tools for developing this long-term rebuilding.

As a sending agency EEMN has placed career missionaries in Poland, Latvia, Ukraine, and Hungary. From the historic fall of communism to the steady progress being made, the work of God in these nations is best described by the prophet Habakkuk, "Look among the nations and see, wonder and be astounded for I am doing a work in your day that you would not believe if told" (Habakkuk 1:5). Out of the hard and rocky soil of atheistic communism, God has prepared a field ripe for harvest.
