Meanwhile, "yes way," our lives have changed in a changing world, but our faith is in the Changeless One, our Lord Jeshua haMachiach, Christ Jesus our Lord.

Grace and Peace to you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

Well, with no pun intended, we can say that the month of July was full of fireworks! Now with two lightening strikes and a fire, God is telling us that we need to pull together and make all things new!

As many of you know, we were hit by lightening at 5:27 a.m. on Thursday, July 12. The lightening bolt came in at the top of the cross, traveled down the ground wire and bolted out through the bottom where the speakers are for the carillon. It blew a hole in the roof of the cupola and started the whole cupola on fire. The bolt was so severe it broke one of the rafters under the roof and knocked out some of our ceiling over the altar. Thankfully, it was reported by a passer-by who immediately called 911. Five fire engines arrived within minutes including the hook and ladder. They pried open the east door with hardly any damage at all, ran inside, took the plastic that was covering all the altar items, pulled it all together and ran to place them in the back pew (the bible, cross, collection plates, etc). They then placed giant tarps over the altar, pulpit and podium. They covered the pianos and other items too. This must have been done before the water even started coming through the roof. I was called on my cell phone at about 5:35 and told by the police that the church was on fire and they wanted to know if anyone was in the building. They asked how quickly I could come and Gary and I were there within 10 minutes. They were still putting water on the roof, when we arrived, but the fire was out. When we were allowed to enter, one of the firemen presented me with the bible from the altar and I started to cry. There is a little tear on the top of the page that is open to the 23rd Psalm. I thanked them over and over for doing their best to care for our things. They then began instructing me on what I needed to do... Call an electrician, your insurance agent and get a fire and restoration service here as soon as possible. I started calling and lining up the help we needed. Our phone system blew out again so had to use my cell phone. I met with the adjuster on Thursday evening and had one of the Restoration people explain to our church council the restoration process. (Yes, we had a council meeting on top of it and met in the parsonage basement - Pastor's Carl's home). He shared it will take 3 to 6 months to make all the repairs needed. I called Master's Piano shop and he explained that the smoke is toxic and will ruin the strings and components on the pianos and organ. We had them removed on the 18th and they will be cleaned, checked and stored off site until we are ready to have them back. As water came into the basement through the floor above the kitchen and part of the fellowship area, those areas are now being cleaned - all the dishes are being removed from the cupboards and washed and cupboards are being washed down. All the hymnals, song books and other items have been removed from the sanctuary and ozoned. All of our audio visual equipment will be checked for damage and may need to be replaced. Demolition of the ceiling over the altar will hopefully begin next week and we can then better access the damage to the electrical at that point. Mark Youngren will be meeting with the restoration estimator to see how much structural damage has been done and how we will rebuild the cupola so we are up to code. I will be working closely with the restoration team to make sure all our items are being cared for. We hope to have services in our fellowship hall beginning on August 12. We will keep you posted. A special thanks to all of those that have offered to pitch in wherever needed. Also a thank you to Gary's BNI group that has donated \$910.00 to date to our church. This will about cover the cost of our \$1000.00 deductible. Praise God how He works! Our copier and phone will be covered by insurance also and will be replaced soon. We continue to move forward with installation of our new boiler and complete our brick and drainage project.

Please, please, have patience with us and with each other during this time. We will not be whole for a while yet. When this is over, all of the rooms in our church will be clean and organized. With God's help, we will be all shiny and new before Christmas. Continue to pray for a new Pastor to lead us and for our restoration project. August Mission of the Month:

Lutheran Bible Translators

Lutheran Bible Translators (LBT) has been bringing the Scriptures to people without the Bible for 50 years. An independent Lutheran mission organization, their missionary efforts are funded completely by the generous donations of churches and individuals.

Starting in Liberia and Sierra Leone, they have grown to 78 missionaries serving in 17 countries on 5 continents. LBT missionaries, working with local churches and partners, have helped translate over 30 New Testaments, making God's Word available to more than 7 million people. But there are still more than 4,000 languages in the world have no portion of the Scriptures translated into their language. This represents over 350 million people.

Translation is at the heart of what LBT does, but it is only the beginning. LBT missionaries organize and help co-ordinate literacy and Scripture Engagement programs. Those who can learn to read obviously benefit from the printed New Testament translations. For those who cannot read they develop other types of communication and media, including CD's and DVD's. LBT missionaries also encourage, promote and help develop use of local music and instruments for worship and liturgies.

As people use, study, and share Scripture, their lives are transformed through God's grace and the Holy Spirit. LBT believe all people should have the opportunity to understand God's Good News as presented in the Scriptures. No language or cultural barrier should prevent people from having access to God's Word.
