Call Committee Update

As the new year begins, the process of calling a new full-time pastor will move ahead. We expect to receive during the month of January names of available candidates from our Presiding Pastor, Rev. Curtis Leins. As soon as we receive the names, we plan to contact the candidates and arrange the first interviews.

Meanwhile, the Call Committee is considering conducting forums at which members will be encouraged to offer their expectations and suggestions regarding pastoral leadership. We are also putting together a written questionnaire that will help us poll the congregation.

To be able to vote when a pastor is called, Article VI section B3 of the constitution stipulates that "Voting Members shall be those who are members in good standing, and who have attained the age of 18 years." The Council is in the process of putting together a current Voting Member list.

Our constitution stipulates that "It shall be the privilege and duty of members to:

1. Make diligent use of the Means of Grace, both Word and Sacraments;

2. Live a Christian life in accordance with the Word of God and the Confession of the Church;

3. Support the work of the congregation and of The American Association of Lutheran Churches."

If you have any questions whether you are an official Voting Member, please let the Council know.

The Call of a pastor will be by a 2/3 majority vote at a rightly called Congregational Meeting. The quorum is 25% of the Voting Members. Voting is by secret ballot and members must be present at the meeting to vote.
