

The Founders were concerned about the Federal Government embracing the Church of England as the state church of all of the colonies just as it was in England. Although the state of Virginia had indeed adopted the Church of England as its official church and had taxed its citizens to support it, other colonies were not so disposed and made sure that Virginia's plan was not made mandatory for the other states.

And although, just as in any society, there were anti-church and anti-faith citizens and politicians, the overwhelming majority of representatives were people of faith who wished to preserve religious freedom and promote faith among the people.

On this Fourth of July, pray that the pernicious idea of separation of citizens from their faith will be exposed for the fraud that it has become. We are now a secularized nation with less than 50 percent of our people involved in their faith. Pray that people will return to faith in God through Christ our Lord who is the true ruler of all nations and the hearts of all people.

# Special Congregational Meeting to be held - July 11 at 6:30 PM to be held in the Fellowship Hall

<u>Purpose of the meeting:</u>

To vote on proposed expenditures to replace our boiler and make repairs to brickwork on the exterior of the building.

Our current boiler is 16 years old. Life expectancy for a boiler of this type is between 15 and 20 years. This boiler has been problematic mostly due to venting and exhaust issues and CLC has spent \$18,000.00+ over the past 3 years for boiler repairs/maintenance. Our boiler technicians have recommended additional repairs that will cost over \$10,000.00. Due to the age of the unit and additional costs, it has been recommended that we replace the system. The council is reviewing bids; current bids are between \$32-50,000.

Many of you may have noticed the deteriorating brick on the outside of our building. Some brick faces are falling off. There are drainage issue causing some of the problems and that also needs to be addressed. We will be replacing brick in some areas, tuckpointing areas where it is needed and recaulking the expansion joints. Estimates for this work are running about \$15,000.

The proposed boiler replacement must be voted on as any expenditures over \$25,000 must be approved by the congregation per the CLC Constitution/Bylaws.

We need your input in a timely manner, so these issues can be addressed before the next heating season. The exterior repairs will only become more expensive and widespread the longer they are delayed.

We are working to get several bids for both projects.

Also of note, The building was probably hit by lightening in a recent storm. This caused many electrical issues in the building that are still being sorted out including: our phone system which was fried (we currently have temporary equipment), damage to office computer and copying machine in basement, several cables were fried. An insurance claim will be filed once we have a comprehensive list of equipment that was affected.

We are blessed with having money in our investment account to cover the projected costs. The council is asking members to prayerfully consider additional giving for these projects (place in a separate envelope and label Building Fund, envelopes are in the pews).

Dear Christ Lutheran Church Family,

Greetings to you in the name of Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord!

We have had many changes over the month of June in our church and feel it best to inform everyone through our Messenger Newsletter. You should all be made aware that the leadership of Christ Lutheran Church has experienced some great losses. Your leaders give countless hours of their time and talents. It has been stressful, no doubt, however, actions and words have consequences. It is not necessarily one event or comment but a culmination of attitudes and actions over time that has resulted in resignations. Our Council President, Jim Carlson has stepped down from his position as the President of our church and Chair of the Call Committee. Bob Halvorson also left the Call Committee. Others of us are praying that God will give us direction and provide healing. In turn, the Call Committee was not able to focus on the Call process. The Call Committee did meet June 14 with the petition authors and resolution was agreed upon. The Church Council was then updated by Mark Wiita. To be clear, per our constitution, everyone has the right to call a special meeting with 25 or more signatures. To those of you that signed a paper in regard to one of our candidates a couple of weeks ago, this was actually a petition to call a special meeting and you should be receiving an explanation of that process very soon. If you do not receive a personal notice within a week or two, please contact me. For those of you that did not sign, but are wondering what is going on – a copy of the explanation is also printed in this Messenger. We are working through this in a Christ-like manner. The Call Committee has resumed the Call process. Moving forward, as a reminder, we encourage anyone with questions regarding the Call process to please speak directly to one of our Call Committee members. Mark Wiita is the chair, other members are Mike Pickar, Lillian Fontaine, Kim Matuseski, Kim Mitchell, Keith Youngren, and Carolyn Lofald. Thank you for your understanding. We ask you to support this whole process with prayer. The Call Committee will be contacting another candidate and setting up an interview very soon. As we have in the past, we will keep you updated as to our future decisions. Pastor Cooper has been contacted and is continuing to pray about the position, he is still a viable candidate for consideration.

Our church motto is: "To know Christ and to Make Him Known". We come to Church on Sunday to Worship our Lord and Savior and we glorify Him through our words and actions. So, as way to keep our Sunday's sacred and be in good fellowship with one another, we would like to "Proclaim" that every Sunday at Church be "Our Father's Day"! Come with a thankful heart and Worship our Heavenly Father and spend time loving and encouraging your neighbor; not grumbling and being negative. Speak to each other as if you are speaking directly to Christ himself. Ephesians 4:32 reads: *Be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.* 

During our announcements on Sunday mornings, we will give you as much information as is available at the time to keep you updated of the Process. If you have a concern about something, we ask that you give a Council Member or Call Committee member a phone call during the week. We would be happy to discuss the issue or give you direction on whom to speak with. Again, let us keep Sundays as a day of Worship, a day to catch up with our church family and a day to Love one another!

It is our hope to have a Prayer Meeting every Wednesday evening as we keep our Church and the Call Process in Prayer. Please check with our church office for times. Please pray for healing for those who are hurting, and be praying for wisdom for our leaders and the Call Committee of this church, for God to guide and direct all of our words and actions, to place a new Shepherd into our flock and for brotherly love and unity to abound in Christ Lutheran Church.
