Greetings!

As many of you know, the Call Committee held a special congregational meeting on September 19 and we voted to call Pastor Paul Hueter and to accept the compensation package that was presented. We called Dr. Lein's that same evening and he in turn contacted Pastor Hueter to let him know our decision and discuss our compensation package with him. Hopefully by our next newsletter we will know if Pastor Hueter has accepted our call and we will be making plans to move him to Duluth. He had mentioned to us when he was here that he would be interested in purchasing a home so this is also part of his decision making process. Please keep praying God's will for this decision.

In regard to our lightning strike and fire, our insurance claims have been renegotiated between our restoration company, a field adjuster, and our insurance company adjuster and were finally approved as of September 26th. There is much more that needs to be done than what they had initially anticipated especially in regards to the electrical. There is also an open window for unforeseen items that are found as repairs are being made. Our insurance company, Brotherhood Mutual has issued checks directly to us and now and we will be paying subcontractors directly for their work upon completion. It is a little more paper work on our end, but we ultimately have control of dispersing those funds. The cross will be coming down and repairs will begin soon.

Our electrician has given us the go-ahead to have our new boiler installed. We will be making that our top priority now and get that scheduled with the cold weather approaching. We have started cleaning out closets and shelves in Fellowship Hall, the copy room, Sunday school – blue room and the Library. We ask that if you have items in these closets to come forward and go through them or ask if a different location has been assigned for them. We have added more shelving for Sunday school materials so that has freed up storage space in other areas. Again, we will be making all things clean and organized for when our new pastor comes. Painting is also scheduled to begin soon.

Again, thank you for being patient and praying for so many things during this process. We don't know why God allowed all of this to happen, but we can see His hand in many things now. No matter what our personal thoughts and feelings are about things we need to work in unity and accept things as they are. Please read Philippians Chapter 2.

May God bless us and provide all things needed in a timely fashion so we may be whole again soon.



October Mission of the Month:
Minnesota Adult & Teen Challenge

For over 30 years Minnesota Adult and Teen Challenge has been assisting teens and adults in gaining freedom from chemical addictions and other life-controlling problems by addressing their physical, emotional and spiritual needs.

Teen Challenge offers a residential program for teenage girls and boys struggling with chemical addictions, as well as behavioral problems.

For teens, there are both long and short term options. Programming is provided in a structured therapeutic community offering continuous observation and treatment by professional multidisciplinary staff members.

Additionally, they offer a long term faith-based residential recovery program for adults that assists individuals in gaining freedom from drug and alcohol addiction and the life controlling problems associated with it.

These programs are not offered cost free. Each resident is required to pay monthly room and board fees. Some fees are covered by outside agencies, but the majority of funding comes from private sources such as churches, businesses, and individuals.

In addition to your monetary support, there are several other ways you could help, job/intern opportunities, volunteering, or becoming a mentor.
