Installation

For me being "turned on" means that I am to enable, connect with, and equip you to function as a healthy, vital, warm, enthusiastic, and evangelistic Lutheran Church - all to the glory of God.

So, now I am "all in" – tuned in, turned on, and dialed in to Christ Lutheran Church. Come with me on this journey of faith!


In Matthew 4:19 Jesus says, "Come follow me and I will make you fishers of men!"

OUR 23rd ANNUAL FATHER DAUGHTER

This recap is coming a little late, but wanted to let you know how our Father Daughter Ball went. Our Events were held on two Saturday's; February 2, and February 9, 2019, in the Lake Superior Ballroom of the DECC. Since 2008, we have charged attendees \$25.00 per We made changes with our online ticketing people this year. We now work with iTickets to purchase tickets online and WordCross processes the transactions. This worked well for us this year and helped with costs. Mark Wiita was our emcee the first night and Pastor Kyle Eaton from Rockhill Community Church gave the message. Due to an increase in the number of Father Daughter events being held here in the Northland at three other venues, we had a decrease in numbers with only 637 in attendance the first evening. We had 679 in attendance on the 9th and Gary Lofald emceed. Erik Reinertsen from The Water's Edge Community Church gave the message. Courtney Mitchell and her friend Cadence – students from Cuzzo-Stocke Dance Studio performed a dance for us to the song "Lord I need You". It was beautifully choreographed by Kelly Mitchell. We worked with Northland Special Events and Duluth Event Lighting. Our theme this year was "Under the Sea". We used white table cloths and teal napkins. On each table we had a 9"glass cylinder filled with sand with a votive candle inside. We had a piece of teal raffia glued to the top of each vase with a star fish or sand dollar glued on to it. We also had two smaller votives with white candles placed on mirrors as our centerpieces. We had colored beaded necklaces and rings to look like treasures on each mirror and some chocolate gold coins and Hershey kisses for fun. We had silver curtains for a backdrop behind our DJ and placed fish nets on it to give a tropical theme. We had clear and white balloons attached to that to look like bubbles. Teal up lighting every four feet lit up the whole backdrop for a beautiful effect. On the far ends of the backdrop we had placed our Father Daughter Ball Banners. Duluth Event Lighting was gracious enough to donate their lighting services and also projected water waves on the walls and ceiling and did some up lighting to decorate around the whole room. Café lights and white tulle were strung over the dance floor and gathered together in the center. White and clear balloons hung in sets of three or four hanging down to give the illusion of bubbles throughout the whole ceiling of the ballroom. We served chicken, mashed potatoes, green beans mixed with julienned carrots along with a salad and roll. We had cupcakes decorated with teal sprinkles for dessert from Johnson's Bakery. Lynnette's Portrait Design was there to take photographs. Eric King from Diamond Max Entertainment was our DJ. We were blessed to receive monetary donations from Lynnette's Portrait Design of \$650.00. NBC Bank, 4th Street Auto Repair and CLC Sunshine Group each gave \$500.00 Discoverpc.net donated \$100.00. Members from our congregation donated money for tickets for the Teen Challenge Dads and their daughters - 11 from their group came. Thank You to all from our church who donated money for their tickets! Gift certificates were provided from Cirrus, Fly Duluth, Grandma's Restaurant, Perkins, Blackwoods & Nevada Bob's Golf. JoAnna Carlson-Danielson created our programs this year using the same theme. We thank ShelDon and Northland Special Events for discounting their services to help us out. We were very blessed to have such a wonderful group of volunteers to help us this year, namely; Jim & Sandy Carlson, Grace Wells, Wendy Pickar, Grace DeRocher, Pearl DeRocher, Gayle Maruska, Susie Decker, Stacy Homstad, Don, Tammy & Adam Renne, Kelly Mitchell, Debbie Showalter and Judy Stocke. Julie and Alondra Guddeck and their friend Britt Anderson worked the coatroom for us. They have a wonderful Candy Ministry that you can ask them about! Kim Kirkland helped also and Mary Jo Miller from our daycare was our bathroom attendant. We also thank our church secretary, Judi Morgan, for all her help with making tickets, directing phone and email messages to our committee and helping with all the extras that we needed. We were thankful that Pastor Gary & Sue were able to stop down to the DECC and witness this event too. We thank our congregation for their prayer support over all these years.
