It's A New Season

How many of you remember Nat King Cole's hit record, "Those Lazy, Hazy, Crazy Days of Summer?"

"Roll out those lazy, hazy, crazy days of summer; Those days of soda and pretzels and beer; Roll out those lazy, hazy, crazy days of summer; Dust off the sun and moon and sing a song of cheer; Just fill your basket full of sandwiches and weenies; Then lock the house up, now you're set; Roll out those lazy, hazy, crazy days of summer; You'll wish that summer could always be here."

How many of us have been craving for summer days? How many of us have been saying to ourselves, is this going to be an endless winter? Remember the 9.1 inches of wet snow the first week of May this year? Uffda/Oofda!

I remember a lot from music, movies, different songs and jingles during my lifetime. Sometimes they trigger wonderful memories, they trigger things I don't want to remember, and then sometimes they trigger memories of sorrowful events.

Speaking of endless seasons of the year, I remember a movie called "Endless Summer." I remember it so well, as a guy who grew up in Florida, and going to the beach was like putting my flip flops on every morning! The "Endless Summer" movie was about two surfers, Mike Hynson and Robert August, on a surfing trip around the world. Despite the balmy climate of their native California, cold ocean currents make local beaches inhospitable during the winter. So, they end up traveling to the coasts of Australia, New Zealand, Tahiti, Hawaii, Senegal, Ghana, Nigeria and South Africa in a quest for new surf spots and a chance to introduce locals to the sport. Its title comes from the idea, expressed at both the beginning and end of the film, that if one had enough time and money it would be possible to follow the summer up and down the world (northern to southern hemisphere and back), making it an endless summer.

Well, up here in the North country, especially here in Duluth, summer isn't endless, and surfing during gale

force winds in waters pushing 45 degrees, isn't suitable for guys like Mike Hynson and Robert August. I've been told there may be just one month of honest summer! Doesn't that make you wonder?

However, when we observe what we have up here in this part of the United States, Minnesota, and the world, we see people sailing, fishing, exploring, playing all kinds of sports. There boasts a far-from-ordinary level of outstanding fine art and performance offerings and many means of entertainment. Even though the temperatures outside are frightful, there is always warmth inside. When the sun shines, and it gets warm, you can go down to Lake Superior, and for the most part, the air is cool.



The Sending Place

The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few, pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest. Go your way; behold I send you out as lambs in the midst of wolves.

Luke 10:2,3

The Sending Place exists to help the individual believer and entire congregations be personally involved in declaring God's glory to the nations. The Sending Place recruits willing servants from all over the country to be obedient "goers," and then trains them for five months, two Saturdays per month, before they are sent overseas in teams to serve the needs of the host ministries in such places as Brazil, Guatemala, India, Kenya, Poland, Russia, South Africa, Thailand, Turkey, the Ukraine, Ghana, China, Indonesia, etc. The actual short-term mission trips last around 2-3 weeks at a time. So almost everyone, from age 18 on up, can do this kind of mission work.

The Bible makes it clear that the mission of preaching the gospel to every creature is to be the main focus of ALL people who are followers of Jesus Christ. For those people who are not "going" right now, you can be "senders" by providing finances, prayers, encouragement, and support to those who are going.
