In John 3:8, Jesus says, "The wind blows where it wants to, and you hear its sound, but you don't know where it comes from or where it's going. That's how it is with everyone who has been born from the Spirit."

Nicodemus had objected to Jesus' teaching because he did not understand. Jesus shows him that he ought not to reject it on that account, for he constantly had a problem believing. Jesus' words might appear incomprehensible, but His teaching was to be understood by its effects. As in this case of the wind, the effects were seen, the sound was heard, important changes were produced by it, trees and clouds were moved, yet the wind is not seen, nor do we know where it comes, nor by what laws it is governed. So it is with the operations of the Holy Spirit in the life of a person. When the Holy Spirit comes, we see the changes produced. Men who

are sinful become holy; the thoughtless become serious; the licentious become pure; the vicious, moral; the moral, religious; the prayerless, prayerful; the rebellious and obstinate, meek, mild, and gentle. When we see such changes, we ought no more to doubt that they are produced by God - by the mighty Agent, than when we see the trees moved, or the waters of the ocean piled upon heaps, or feel the cooling effects of a summer's breeze. In those cases we attribute it to the "wind," even though we do not see it, and we do not understand how it operates. Here are four things we learn from this passage:

1. That the proper evidence of conversion is the effect of change on the life.
2. That we must not search for the cause or manner of the change on the life.
3. That God has power over the most hardened sinner to change him, as He has power over the loftiest oak, to bring it down by a sweeping blast.
4. That there is a great variety of the modes of the operation of the Holy Spirit. As the "wind" sometimes sweeps with a tempest, and knocks everyone down all before it, and sometimes blows upon us in a mild evening zephyr, so it is with the operations of the Holy Spirit. The sinner sometimes trembles and is prostrate before the truth, and sometimes is sweetly and gently drawn to the cross of Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit's invisible operations gives visible evidence of His power. The Holy Spirit works His own way beyond our comprehension just like we do not know the law of the wind.

So, as our summer draws nearer and covers us with its warmth, remember as you feel the summer breeze upon your face, that God, by the invisible power of His Holy Spirit has moved you and changed you, and is in the process of changing you, from glory to glory into the blessed, holy image of His Son, our Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Maintenance Update!!!

“Behold, I am making all things new” Revelation 21:5, “The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, His mercies never come to an end – they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness” Lamentations 3:23.

It’s hard to believe, but we are coming up on one year since we were struck by lightning and had our fire – July 12, 2018. We have weathered the storm and we are on the final stretch of finishing all the repairs. Just about everything in our church is new or has been restored. We are so thankful that our Lord continues to provide for all of our needs, not only materially, but spiritually also. He is faithful. Thanks be to God!

The cupola stained glass should be installed very soon and the Carillon should be playing by the time you have your Messenger in hand. We are reviewing all our invoices with the adjuster and as soon as we have that all approved the insurance company will make their final pay-out. Praise God! Thanks to all of you for being prayerful, steadfast and supportive. The bricks that needed attention on the outside of our building are being replaced and tuck pointing is being completed. New weather proofing and membrane has been applied to the foundation of the east and west sides of the exterior of the building to prevent water intrusion. New drain tile has been added to the east wall outside the Sunday school room and the dirt has been built up to divert the water away from the building. We have also redone the rock garden at the west entrance and added a new retaining wall with drain tile. We added a French drain to catch the water run off from the roof in front of the windows as a gutter doesn’t work there. We are also replacing the old weathered wooden siding with vinyl siding on the east and west sides to match the vinyl on the cupola and between our sanctuary windows. We have also made some improvements to the existing gutters. We will need some volunteers to stain the siding on the back entrance of the church. A big thank-you to Esther Circle, too.

They have purchased new flower pots and have planted the gardens. Everything looks so nice.

We will be replacing the blacktop at the back door with concrete before winter comes again to make for a smooth entrance. We will be crack filling and doing some pot hole repairs on our parking lot in hopes of buying us a few more years of wear. The cost to remove and replace the pavement for the lot will run over \$100,000.00 when the time comes to replace it. We will need to start saving for that.

We are thankful for those that contributed to the purchase of our play-set. A big thank you to Stacy & Tyler Homstad for putting that all together for us with the help of Stacy’s dad, Bruce Wells. Our VBS children were able to use it for a few days and had so much fun! We will be finalizing that project very soon and will need a few more volunteers to help with that.

The parsonage roof has also been re-shingled. We were blessed to totally pay for that project with the warranty money that we received from our church shingles. Praise God!

We would still like to get the garage cleaned out and re-organized and the old copy room needs a little TLC. Other than painting a few more areas in our church, we have taken care of everything that needed attention. We appreciate all the cooperation and support we have received during this process also.

We again praise God for all He has blessed us with. Our thanks to all of you that have stepped up and continue to help with regular maintenance and helping to keep everything looking so nice – Bless your heart!

Sandy's Oatmeal Chocolate Chip Cake (Recipe also available at the office)

Mix together in a large microwaveable bowl:

1 $\frac{3}{4}$ C water, 1 cup regular oatmeal, $\frac{1}{2}$ C butter or margarine (1 stick, cut into pieces)

Microwave on high for 3 minutes and let stand until cool. (Alternative: add 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ C boiling water to oatmeal and margarine in a bowl)

To cooled oatmeal mixture add and mix well:

1 C white sugar

1 C packed brown sugar

2 Large eggs

Sift together and add to mixture, mix well

1 $\frac{3}{4}$ C flour

1 Tsp baking soda

$\frac{1}{2}$ Tsp salt

$\frac{1}{2}$ Tsp Cinnamon

$\frac{1}{2}$ Tsp Nutmeg

Add half of the chocolate chips (12 ounce bag) and mix well. Pour into greased and floured cake pan. Sprinkle on the rest of the chocolate chips and $\frac{3}{4}$ C chopped walnuts. Bake at 350 for about 40 minutes.
