## Spiritual Acuity for 2020

When I hear "2020", I think of my eyesight. Which is not 20/20. I wish it was. It's pretty poor. When you think of eyesight, you think in terms of visual acuity. Therefore, what is 20/20 vision?

20/20 vision is a term used to express normal visual acuity (the clarity or sharpness of vision) measured at a distance of 20 feet. If you have 20/20 vision, you can see clearly at 20 feet what should normally be seen at that distance. If you have 20/100 vision, it means that you must be as close as 20 feet to see what a person with normal vision can see at 100 feet. Some people can see well at a distance but are unable to bring nearer objects into focus. This condition can be caused by *farsightedness* or *loss of focusing ability*. Others can see items that are close but cannot see those far away. This condition may be caused by *nearsightedness*.

Last year, the first time I met with our church council, I laid out a five-year plan: 1<sup>st</sup> year: Preparation for Discovery; 2<sup>nd</sup> year - Recovering our Vision; 3<sup>rd</sup> year - Discovering New Paths for Outreach; 4<sup>th</sup> year - Equipping to reach our community for Christ; and 5<sup>th</sup> year - Learning How to be Missional in a Post-Church Culture.

Our first year was the process of discovery; for me, it has been discovering who you were individually and as a congregation; and for you, it has been discovering who I am as your pastor and getting to know Sue and me. There have been adjustments made; challenges met; and a period of growth that hasn't been seen in numbers specifically. By growth, I mean that you are in the midst of recovery from loss, conflicts, and change. You are growing toward spiritual maturity. You have turned to God for His rescue, relief, and restoration. Now as we embark upon a new decade and a new year, we look to God to recover the vision for Christ Lutheran Church.

Remember, 20/20 vision only indicates the sharpness or clarity of vision at a distance. We must look ahead, however, we must not neglect where we are at present.

There are important aspects of vision which include, 1) peripheral vision; 2) eye coordination; 3) depth perception; 4) focusing ability; and 5) color vision. All of these contribute to the overall mission of Christ Lutheran Church.

Peripheral vision. We must be able to see spiritually all around us here at Christ Lutheran Church. We must not be caught unaware or blindsided by things. We must go to God and ask for spiritual discernment and awareness.

Eye coordination. This is the ability to see with both eyes in the same direction. Once again, it is my desire to know that every member of Christ Lutheran Church is on the same page, regarding the Christian faith, God's Word, the Sacraments, and the Lutheran confessions. It is very important to know what we believe and why we believe it.

Depth perception. Jesus said, "Can a blind man lead a blind man? Will they not both fall into a pit?" Luke 6:39 (ESV) We must be able to walk upon the path of righteousness that our Lord leads us. We must open our eyes to His guidance and direction, both from His Word and the Holy Spirit. We must take care of our depth perception, so we do not fall.

Focusing ability. Our mission is to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ to a lost and dying world. We must be willing and able to give the Gospel away, leaving these four walls and risk giving ourselves and the Gospel to others. We must guard ourselves from becoming nearsighted, unable to see ahead. We must guard ourselves from becoming farsighted, unable to see what is right in front of us. We must be able to focus on our mission. (cont. p. 3)

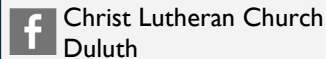

Color Vision. To perceive color requires light. What does that mean for Christ Lutheran Church? Matthew 6:22-23 (NRSV) helps us understand, "The eye is the lamp of the body. So, if your eye is healthy, your whole body will be full of light; but if your eye is unhealthy, your whole body will be full of darkness. If then the light in you is darkness, how great is the darkness!"

Jesus quotes a common Jewish proverb and comments on it. When He says, "if your eye is healthy," He is talking about being generous. When your eye is "unhealthy" it means you are stingy in heart; in other words, you are unwilling to give money, time, and resources for the sake of Gospel.

This interpretation is confirmed by the context. Greed and anxiety about money is the topic in both verses 21 and 24. So, without light in the eye, the brain cannot perceive color. There is only darkness, black or grey. If we are unwilling to give of our resources, time, and money to our mission, we will become unhealthy and darkness will overcome us. If we are healthy, we will bring light to darkness to those around us, and they will be able to perceive the colorful riches of the glory of Jesus Christ and His salvation.

Our mission statement is "To know Christ and make Him known." As your pastor, my objective is to lead and guide you to accomplish that mission.

My vision for Christ Lutheran Church is the vision I saw before I even accepted the call – to be a beacon of light shining the Gospel to Duluth, Minnesota. I still have that vision and I challenge you to grasp that vision and walk with me in it.

We, as the Body of Christ, must come together as one, continually growing in faith, trusting in Jesus Christ as our Savior and Lord. We are to submit to Christ's Lordship in the power of the Holy Spirit, building up one another in love.

We, as the Body of Christ, must come together as one, reaching out, taking risks for the sake of the Gospel, and make Him known to those who are lost in Duluth, Minnesota.

Therefore, let's march forward together, hand in hand, standing firm for the sake of the Gospel, winning souls, growing in the grace and knowledge of Jesus Christ in the power of the Holy Spirit, with a keen vision that is clear and sharp for our mission, and operate with spiritual vision that is 20/20 for the year 2020 and beyond!

### GOOD NEWS CLUB & PIEDMONT ELEMENTARY

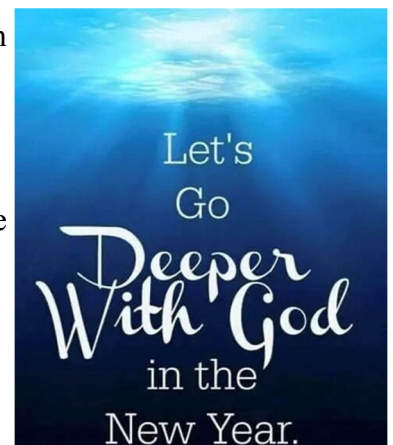

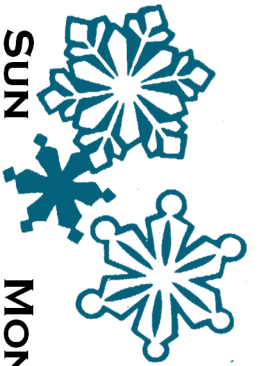
