Foundations for Renewal in 2023

It has been three years or so since restrictions were placed on our Church during the COVID-19 pandemic. The rising censorship of churches, Christian-based organizations and leaders has made it all the more apparent that opposition toward the Christian faith and morality is only increasing. An increased number of Christians have stopped attending worship services!

I believe we are stepping into the times of severe testing where we are about to find out if we are made of the same stuff as the apostles. We are about to find out if we are willing to stand for God's truth, whatever the cost. We must reevaluate our priorities.

The past 36 months have been in recovery from crisis. Now, we must take hold of the open door for transformation and renewal of our Church. We must take the following action steps for Christ Lutheran Church to move into spiritual renewal:

- 1. As Christians, we should morally and spiritually purify ourselves turning from sin and turning to God for forgiveness and restoration. For God has promised, "If my people, who are called by My name, will humble themselves and pray and seek My face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land." (2 Chron. 7:14). How do we move in this direction?
 - With a new desire for the Holy Scriptures, the Bible, as God's living Word
 - With a deeper experience of the reality, holiness, and transcendence of God
 - With a deeper understanding and love of God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit
 - With a deeper understanding of the Lordship of Jesus Christ
 - With a deeper understanding of the Person and work of the Holy Spirit (cont. page 3)

- 2) As Christians, we must pray for our nation. I urge you as believers to thank God for our country and ask Him to send revival to His Church. Pray for God to turn every church and home into a house of prayer; ask Him to purify His people so that the bride of Christ would be faithful and holy; and ask Him to set us apart as His followers, consecrated to His service and the preaching of His Gospel. How do we move in this direction?
- With a renewed and revitalized spirit in the lay leadership of Christ Lutheran Church
- With a new desire for praying for the healing of the sick
- 3) As Christians, we must persevere in declaring the Gospel to everyone around us. Whether people receive the Good News with joy or reject it, we must never give up. We must never compromise. Do not ever stop giving your testimony, or ever stop witnessing. How do we move in this direction?
- With the renewal of the spiritual life of Christ Lutheran; each and every member coming alive in Christ.
- With a new urgency for evangelism, missions, and witnessing in the power of the Holy Spirit.
- With a renewed spontaneity, openness, freedom, and joy through praise and worship in the power of the Holy Spirit.

The apostles could have prayed, 'Lord, stop these evil men! Silence them! Defeat them! Thwart their plans!' That was not the prayer of Peter and John. Instead, they prayed, 'Now, Lord, consider their threats and enable your servants to speak Your word with great boldness' (Acts 4:29). They prayed for boldness! To follow the Apostolic way, the following is our model:

"And they were continually devoting themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to the prayers. And fear came upon every soul; and many wonders and signs were taking place through the apostles. And all those who had believed were together and had all things in common; and they began selling their property and possessions and were dividing them up with all, as anyone might have need. And daily devoting themselves with one accord in the temple and breaking bread from house to house, they were taking their meals together with gladness and sincerity of heart, praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord was adding to their number daily those who were being saved." Acts 2:42-47 (LSB)

Time is even shorter now. We must pray for renewal and transformation, boldness rather than safety, courage rather than fear, confidence rather than despair. At Christ Lutheran Church, we must obey God rather than any human being or government.

It's beyond time to pray. Please join me in ministry to proclaim Christ to our community and accept this challenge. Make Him known! We can move beyond where we used to be, into a whole new place where God wants us to be!
