
If you are interested in serving in this ministry, we are willing to train!

# **October Maintenance Report**

We have been blessed beyond measure with all the material things God has provided for our church, and to honor our Lord, we need to care for all He has given to us. Soon the Esther Circle will be putting the church gardens to bed for another year. We have so enjoyed the beauty they provided for us and our visitors.

As fall is now upon us, we will be having our annual maintenance checks for the boilers at both the church and also the parsonage to make sure they are in proper working order for the heating season. A pump will need to be replaced on the parsonage boiler system. All of our fire extinguishers are scheduled to be checked by the Fire Department and our smoke alarms and exit signs will be checked too.

We will be installing a whole house dehumidifier system at the parsonage by Basement Water Systems. (They originally placed the beaver system along the basement front wall and installed the sump pump and alarm to help with past water issues.) This dehumidifier will help with moisture control. Mold and dust mite spores have been causing a musty smell for quite some time. It will function way more effectively than the portable units that we have been trying to empty and maintain daily. The air conditioning units have now been removed from the windows for the winter, too.

The trustees have approved flooring for the basement of the parsonage and we are waiting to have some larger samples to make a final color decision. We have painted a section of the front wall with Dry Lok paint and will reinstall the paneling we had removed to confirm that we didn't have a water issue. Gary Lofald and Mike Pickar were able to work on this project. Our thanks to Bruce Wells for removing the tack strip along the perimeter of the basement in preparation for the flooring. He also took time and stretched the carpet in our fireside room at church that had a large wrinkle in it. Thank you, Bruce! Now we can have that carpet cleaned.

We are looking into replacing the driveway at the parsonage to improve drainage by sloping the driveway away from the building. The current driveway has sunk down two inches by the foundation. We will also look into widening the driveway to accommodate two cars parking side by side.

Our Church Parking lot fund is sitting at approximately \$13,000.00. The CD will be maturing soon and we will look into reinvesting that to add to our goal. Please keep an eye on the sign in our Fellowship Hall for updates. Our goal is to reach \$150,000.00.

Benson Electric will be installing a new can light over each of our office doors for better visibility and safety. These will illuminate when the narthex lights are switched on. We are hoping to get to those outside projects before the weather turns. Jim Carlson was able to trim up the front trees for better visibility of our church electronic sign. Thanks Jim! He continues to mow and trim to keep the grounds looking nice for us. Another thank you goes out to Don Olson for donating a loveseat, lamps, end tables and chairs for our parsonage. He also donated a nice bench for church.

We thank God for providing us with the resources to care for our church. We thank Him for giving our church members the gifts and abilities to repair items when needed We welcome anyone willing to volunteer for one or more of our projects. Please call or visit with me at church if you are interested in lending a helping hand. If you note something that needs to be addressed, please bring it to our attention. # October Mission of the Month: MN Adult & Teen Challenge

For over 30 years Minnesota Adult and Teen Challenge has been assisting teens and adults in gaining freedom from chemical addictions and other life-controlling problems by addressing their physical, emotional and spiritual needs.

Teen Challenge offers a residential program for teenage girls and boys struggling with chemical addictions, as well as behavioral problems.

For teens, there are both long and short term options. Programing is provided in a structured therapeutic community offering continuous observation and treatment by professional multidisciplinary staff members.

Additionally, they offer a long term faith-based residential recovery program for adults that assists individuals in gaining freedom from drug and alcohol addiction and the life controlling problems associated with it.

Theses programs are not offered cost free. Each resident is required to pay monthly room and board fees. Some fees are covered by outside agencies, but the majority of funding comes from private sources such as churches, businesses, and individuals.

In addition to your monetary support, there are several other ways you could help, job/intern opportunities, volunteering, or becoming a mentor.

God Uses a Gift and a Letter to Change Lives As a 7-year-old in Mongolia, Jargalmaa (pictured left with her family) described one particular day as "unexpected." After school, her teacher invited her to a church where she received her very first gift! This Operation Christmas Child shoebox gift included, among other fun toys, stationery, and a set of hairclips. Inside, she also found a letter that said, "You are valuable and so loved by God." Jargalmaa cherished this message because her parents and grandparents had never told her that they loved her. Jargalmaa went on to

participate in "The Greatest Journey" discipleship program where she especially appreciated the lessons about God as Creator. Later in 10th grade, she accepted Jesus as her Lord and Savior. Through her testimony, five of her family members and two close friends also made this life-changing decision. Now, 15 years after receiving her shoebox gift, Jargalmaa, her husband, and two young children have recently moved to a new community where they are ministering to youth in hopes of starting a church. "I would like to challenge people who are preparing shoebox gifts to also write a letter showing God's love," Jargalmaa said. "What's written there may be very simple, but those simple words could completely change somebody's life."
