We have contacted our electrician and he will be installing a new outlet in the balcony to provide an additional receptacle for our livestream equipment. We have also been in contact with DADS Electronics to ask for some advice on our equipment and sound system.

On below zero days, Gary, our custodian, is keeping the church kitchen sink cabinet doors open so the pipes don't freeze. MISSIONS OF CHRIST LUTHERAN

As many of you know, we choose a “Mission of the Month” each month to collect monies to bless various organizations. We also have some missions that are ongoing that are not on that list. We thought it would be good to share with you two of them and give you a little history on how they provide for members and those in need.

Christ Lutheran Food Share

This Food Share is an outreach mission of our church. We have been blessing many families the past couple of years that have come to receive a bag of food. Some have become regulars. We ask if they are in need of prayer and have prayed with them. As you know, the cost of food has increased over the past few years. We watch the grocery ads for what is on sale and plan our meals around that. We try to provide two or three meals in each bag to make the drive to our church worthwhile for these families. This last month we had spaghetti sauce with meat, noodles, parmesan cheese, 2 cans of green beans, peanut butter, grape jelly, pancake mix, and syrup. We also personally hand out a \$15.00 gift card to Super One so the family can buy meat, bread or dairy items they may need and an information sheet of upcoming events at our church and service times. The cost per month for this mission runs between \$900 to \$1000.00. To continue serving needy families, we ask if you would consider a monetary donation. Boxes of cereal are also welcome! Please keep this mission in your prayers! Thank you.

Our Evangelism Committee also serves the families of the Food Share that have young children. We provide a gift bag with one or two Bible Crafts and coloring books. Sometimes we include crayons, paints, chalk or markers. We also put in a snack – like Goldfish crackers. We also have birthday bags available as we ask if there is a family member that has a birthday. We have cake mix, candles, a birthday napkin, and a birthday card. We feel blessed that we are able to provide for these families.

Christ Lutheran Good Samaritan Fund

Many of you may not know this, but our Church has a program called the *Good Samaritan Fund*. This fund was put into place many years ago to provide assistance for people in need. We have used it to buy gas cards, to pay for eye glasses, to offset costs for medical and dental procedures and help with moving and travel expenses. We have a group of three overseers who prayerfully work confidentially with the recipient to assist them as best we can with their request. This fund does not get used very often, but when it does, it provides an enormous blessing - a weight lifted from their shoulders so to speak. This fund is in need of replenishment. By providing a donation, you will allow us to bless others in the future. If you would like to contribute by check, please write Good Samaritan Fund in the memo. If you're contributing cash, please place in an envelope with a note earmarked Good Samaritan Fund. We thank you for considering a donation to this fund.

First and foremost, we thank each of you for your prayers and financial contributions each month to meet our financial obligations. If you are able to give over and above your regular giving to these missions, we thank you. We thank our Lord for His provision over us.

We believe that practicing these things, and getting better at them, will pay far greater dividends in life than practicing our dribbling and shooting will. Please continue to pray for us as we endeavor to have a positive impact on these girls' lives so they can have a positive impact on their school and their community.
