FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

It was during one of the many wars of ancient Greece. A small army was in hopeless retreat. Greatly outnumbered and unable to hold back the enemy that was advancing against them, the disorganized band of only a few hundred managed to make its way through a narrow mountain pass.

Once on the other side of the pass, their commander shouted a new order to them. "STAND! From here we can deal with the enemy." He further explained: "No matter how many men they have, they must come through the narrow passageway of that pass. They must come to us one by one – and one by one we shall conquer."

The Captain of our salvation tells us something very similar as we enter into a New Year of 2025 – the old year passes and a new year begins. Beyond the pass, in the old year that is hidden from our view, lie the problems and complexities that we faced.

Our hearts and minds struggle with the thought of another new year of unknowns, hard tasks, heavy responsibilities, and difficult decisions. In our human weakness we can be overwhelmed by the various possibilities of the unknown year that lies beyond our view.

But, thank God, EACH of those moments is in the hand of our gracious God, and He is going to let them come to us one by one. And with each moment will come the needed grace and power. He has promised that as our days, so shall our strength be. (Deuteronomy 33:25b)

We have the assurance that each moment of the coming new year will find us equipped with the amount of strength that will be necessary to bear its burden, to endure its trial, and to fight its battle through.

And so as we stand at the pass of this new year, let us not be frightened by the overwhelming greatness of its possibilities, but let us rather find comfort and strength in the knowledge that in God's good knowledge and protection ALL the moments of the new year will be coming single file – one moment at a time. And for each moment His needed grace will be supplied. St. Paul says in Philippians 4:19 – "And my God will supply every need of yours according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus."

JANUARY MAINTENANCE REPORT

Winter is now upon us. We will be having Peterson Excavating plowing our parking lot for us again this year. Thankful that the Piedmont Dental Office takes care of the plowing expenses during the workweek. Their donation goes right into our parking lot fund. Peterson will also plow the parsonage driveway for us if needed at a cost of \$30.00 per time. Thank you to Gary L. for finding a used electric start snowblower for us and fixing a few small items and to Jim Carlson for snow blowing for us. Gary G. has also been shoveling the walks for us too as needed. So thankful that we have the heated slab at the lower level entrance.

These are a few items still on the "to do" list for winter.

- Basement Janitor closet doors
- Vinyl base repair in Fellowship Hall
- · Grout repair in upstairs bathroom floor tile
- Base and mopboard areas need touch up

We have ordered a new closet door and hanging rack for the parsonage front hall and will get that installed.

The relay for the parsonage boiler pump has now been replaced as it had been making noise. It malfunctioned on Thanksgiving, but is working well now. Comfort Systems was at the parsonage on December 16, and installed a new water meter.

We will have the top portion of our altar refinished as the varnish is peeling. As you may remember, the fire may have contributed to these issues. There are some base and mopboard areas in the church that need some touch up, too. We will get this scheduled now. The trustees have approved the repair.

We also are looking into a tract rack to hang by the back door for our visitors and parishioners to take for Biblical insight into daily life.

Our church boilers had their annual inspection on December 11. The #1 boiler Breather on Condesate was leaking. They were able to clear the line and stop the small leak. Boiler #2 checked out fine.

The Narthex east side Trane ceiling heater was having vibration noises from the belt driven fans. The metal corners had worn. ASP repaired with zip ties. These are probably the original fans. They are still heating well.

We are waiting to hear back from Arrow Lift in regard to scheduling our load test for the elevator.

MN Power will be installing another light on the lot pole to illuminate the lower part of our parking lot.

Mike Pickar is looking into some ring cameras and the WiFi throughout the church.

If you find there is an area that needs addressing, please bring it to my attention. We are so blessed with a beautiful church home and grounds and are thankful to God for all that we have.

The Esther Circle will be taking down the Christmas decorations after Epiphany Sunday. Everything was so beautifully decorated.
