## **Christ Defeated...the Enemy!**

"And entering the tomb, they saw a young man clothed in a long white robe sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, 'Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid Him." (St. Mark 16:5-6)

There is a story that is told of long ago: when the Battle of Waterloo was being fought, the people of England were dependent on a system of semaphore signals to learn of the news of battle which was being waged fiercely on the opposite side of the channel - against Napoleon Bonaparte. One of these signals was on the tower of Winchester Cathedral.

Late in the day it flashed the disheartening signal: "Wellington defeated." Precisely at that moment, one of those sudden English clouds of fog hid the signal, and the entire countryside was launched into a deep despair. Once the fog lifted, the remainder of the message became clearly visible: "Wellington defeated...the enemy!" Within a few seconds sorrow was turned to joy, and defeat was actually a victory!

After the death and burial of Jesus, His disciples were living in a moment of defeat and despair. Their Master, their Teacher, their Lord was now dead and buried, and they were hiding for fear that the Jewish leaders would come for them, and do to them what they had just done to Jesus. Their faith was shattered, and they were not certain of what they would do next in their lives. All they knew was the disheartened message: "Christ defeated!"

But on that first Easter morning, as the sun rose, the traces of the defeated death of Jesus was lifted, and the full message could be read: "Christ defeated . . . the enemy!" The angel that appeared where the body of Jesus was laid, gave a message of joy, a message of victory to the faithful women coming to the tomb that morning. HE IS RISEN! What words of unspeakable victory, hope and joy. Jesus said this would happen, He would suffer, and die, AND that He would rise again!

In the women and in the disciples, unbelief was turned into belief, lack of faith was turned into strength of faith. His victory over death and the grave was theirs, and it is also ours! Our Savior, our Redeemer completed the work He was sent to do. He has given us salvation, forgiveness and strength for the lives that we live! We are all washed clean of sin in His atoning blood, and have victorious hope of the treasures of a heavenly home he has prepared for us!

Live in His victory! Christ is risen! Alleluia! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

## May Food Share Thursday, May 22 from 11:30-12:30

### **FOOD SHARE REPORT**

As we mentioned last Messenger, we had 13 bags of groceries left over from March. For April we made up another 48 bags that we distributed on April 17, Maundy Thursday. As we wanted to bless those that came with an Easter meal, each bag contained a box of scalloped potatoes, ingredients for pistachio dessert, 2# of fresh carrots and a \$20.00 gift card to Aldi to purchase their ham or other items they may have needed for that meal. As we also want to provide something for a lunch and a breakfast meal, we included a box of Mac & Cheese (.83 cents a box) and a box of pancake mix and a bottle of syrup (\$5.48 combined). The total contents of each bag came to \$18.09. If a family had more than four members, we gave them an additional bag that was left over from last month – all of which are nonperishable. All total we gave out 52 bags of groceries in April. (We have 9 left)

These families were so grateful and some asked us to pray with them. Pastor Mark was there to honor their request. Having him here with us is such a blessing! One lady brought us some t-shirts last month and asked us to please give them to someone that could use them. We took those down to MN Adult and Teen Challenge and they were very grateful. She inquired about those shirts this time and was so pleased to hear that they were given to such a good cause.

Evangelism gave out craft bags that included an Easter Craft, a plastic egg with a treat inside, an Easter coloring sheet and a snack bag of Goldfish. We had some egg coloring kits too that we handed out. Each family was also given an invitation card with our church service times and information on it. We gave out 7 birthday bags too!

It is such an honor and gift to share these bags of food with those in need and show God's love to them; many of whom are regulars. Thank you for your contributions so we are able to continue fulfilling this mission blessing!

## **NEW! ONLINE GIVING OPTION**




Our Church Council made the decision to add online giving. This option is an alternative way to make an offering and donation.

Repairing the retaining walls at the parsonage.

Addressing some drainage issues at both the parsonage and the church to reroute the rain gutter water.

We are looking into installing some sort of patio area at the back entrance of the parsonage.
